Editorial from the Church of the Good Shepherd

November 2025

November is ushered in with the bright flashes of light and explosive bangs of bonfire night. As the month progresses, with ever darkening colder days, light continues to be a theme at the Good Shepherd.

Christians think of Jesus as the light of the world, the saviour that God sent to work against evil. A light to dispel the darkness and gloom often brought about by the acts of people whether deliberately or through thoughtlessness or neglect.

At the beginning of the month we try to bring some of that light, in the form of happiness, into the lives of those less fortunate than ourselves by making up and collecting together shoe boxes filled with gifts and essentials. This year these are to be sent to the poor and needy of Kosovo in time for Christmas.

We also remember our faithful departed in a simple, reflective early evening service for All Souls Day. As part of this service we give thanks for the lives of our loved ones, for all they meant to us and our hope for new life in the resurrection by lighting a candle for them.

A week later on Remembrance Sunday we commemorate all those who have fought and given their lives for the light which is our freedom. The uniformed organisations of the village will join us for this service of remembrance with laying of wreaths and two minutes silence.

Although this final month of autumn can see gloomy darker days, there is always candle light shining as a beacon of hope in the church. Your parish church is open every day, from 10-4 in the winter months, and offers a quiet sacred space for contemplation, for time to put aside the worries and hurries of the day and be at peace. Lighting your own candle at our prayer station is a symbol of love and hope, with the prayer staying alight and continuing in the tranquillity.

We complete November by welcoming in the season of Advent on the last Sunday of the month with an evening service of readings and advent carols. This is a time to reflect on, and look forward to, the time of year when we remember the birth of Jesus, the light and saviour of the world.

Update on appointing a vicar

Over the last months there have been several meetings between the Archdeacon of Tonbridge, Good Shepherd churchwardens and the Parochial Church Council (PCC) to discuss the process of appointing a new vicar. The most recent meeting was a joint one with St Mary's Platt PCC, the Archdeacon and the Area Dean. The discussions have highlighted that Borough Green is no longer able to support a full time vicar and that recruiting and sustaining part time vicars is no longer a realistic solution. The proposal therefore is that Platt and Borough Green become a joint benefice with one vicar. Before we can advertise for a vicar we need to make this decision official. Both PCCs are in agreement that this is a sensible decision as the church moves forward into the future.

Notes from Borough Green Parish Council

The Council met at 7.30pm Monday 6th October 2025 at the COGS Annexe, Matters raised included:



- Recreation Ground Pavilion. Work has begun on the first stage of the renovation of the Memorial Pavilion with the repairs to the roof. It very quickly became apparent that the roof timbers were in a far worse state of rot and rodent damage than we thought. Cllr Proto has engaged with Building Control and we will be carrying out a full rebuild of the roof, including new aluminium fascias and soffits to keep these "visitors" out. The rebuild will include much beefier rafters and joists. Honeycomb have removed the old fibreglass clock, which has been badly damaged, and will be building a new clock tower based on the pre-2007 pictures, together with a new clock face.
 - There have been rebuilds in the past, but this time we intend a rebuild that will keep this important Borough Green building alive and in use for another 70 years.
- Declaration of Town Status. We voted unanimously to consult on declaring Town Status. In the coming weeks we will be launching a consultation that will include a leaflet drop, High St Saturday visits and an online survey. This is a major emotional change in our longstanding Parish status, a very important decision for our Parish. We have to be sure the public understands the reasons and the implications and are fully in agreement. The outcome of the consultation will go before the Council at our January 2026 meeting and a decision taken based on those public results.
- TMBC's Local Plan Reg 18 Consultation should be approved and launched on 21 October, and will run from 10 November until 22 December, and may well be extended to include the Christmas period. This draft will include site lists and housing numbers - the Government has mandated 1109 houses per year to be built in TMBC - so it is vitally important that as many people respond to that consultation as possible.
 - The "Town Consultation" leaflets we will deliver to every house will also carry on the reverse some useful "Local Plan Bullet Points" residents may want to use in any response to the Reg 18 Consultation, plus links to the online versions. This will also be publicised on our website and Facebook pages, and hopefully spread by other local social media.
- Scouts at Potters Mede. Mark Rolfe made a short presentation to the Council outlining their plans for a new Scout HQ next to our current Sports Centre. The Parish Council wholly supports the principle of a new HQ but there will be many more discussions including establishing a lease. The Scouts need that element of comfort from us to allow them to proceed with design, planning and fund raisina.
- Skatepark. There has been some significant vandalism with plywood side panels kicked in. This is most unusual because in the 20 years the park has been open this is the first major incident. Our contractors KAS have the matter well in hand and are fitting steel plate replacement panels. On a happier note children from Borough Green Primary School recently spent an afternoon at the park repainting some panels (and themselves).
- Converd Road Trees. Treeability has delivered some of the chippings from this work for the paths on the Harrison Rd land and our staff recently spread them.



Tom Tugendhat MP's Column

All of us enjoy the quiet beauty of our countryside - the walks across the Downs/Weald, the still mornings and the sense of calm that defines our corner of Kent. That's why the Government's decision to approve a second runway at Gatwick Airport will come as such a disappointment to so many of us.

I will continue to stand alongside the many local campaigners who have spent years working to defend our countryside and our communities. Growth in aviation should bring benefits to those who live nearby as well as to the industry itself - and, at present, that balance has not been struck.

For us in Borough Green, you might ask why this matters? The community I represent goes as far south as Penshurst and Hever. These villages, primarily between Tonbridge and Edenbridge, suffer greatly from noise and environmental issues caused by being directly under the flightpath. Much of this area is a designated National Landscape recognised for its beauty and importance. If this were a motorway on the ground, it would never be approved.

The airport stands to see a major increase in passenger numbers but there remains no commitment to reinstate the direct rail link from Kent to Gatwick - something I believe should be in place before any expansion is allowed to operate. I made this point clearly at the public inquiry, along with the need for stricter limits on night flights, stronger protections from aircraft noise and firm commitments to reduce the carbon impact of the airport. These are not unreasonable requests. They are essential safeguards for those of us who live beneath the flight paths and who already feel the strain of existing traffic in our skies.

Despite my concern at the decision, I will continue to work to try and secure a direct rail link. The work to date shows this coming to Tonbridge, which is much easier to get to than Borough Green and Wrotham. This would help ease traffic on the M25 and M23, and allow us to get to the airport more sustainably.
