
BOROUGH GREEN PARISH CONSULTATION-RESULTS SHORTLIST OF 10 FOR REPLACEMENT TREE



Our Coronation Oak has been looking a bit poorly for some time, and this year KCC decided it was a risk to Highway Safety, and felled it. We have saved logs from it to make memorial benches and plaques.

The Parish Council will be getting a new planter built, and we hope to plant a new tree in December.

We have advice from both KCC and TMBC on a replacement tree, but it can't be another oak, because that will suffer the same fate because the sandy soil deprives them of water.

So we want a fairly small tree, with either blossom or leaves that will contrast against the large Plane tree behind. All the trees in this consultation were listed with an index letter, and the consultation form has been in the library and online for two months, with the results below.

W 1 vote Sorbus aucuparia 'Sheerwater Seedling' – adv: white flowers followed by red berries with leaves turning yellow/orange in autumn; disadv: berries
