#### Editorial from the Church of the Good Shepherd June 2024

#### God's music....

I heard a story about Luis who dreamt about meeting Jesus and being invited to a party in honour of Beethoven. When Luis and Jesus arrived they found lots of guests there along with Beethoven himself and an orchestra playing the great composer's music. However, the orchestra was out of tune, not in time with each other and playing a lot of wrong notes. The other guests started getting upset, turned on Beethoven and started throwing things. Jesus pulled Luis to one side and said, "Just because they can't play his music properly, don't reject the composer.".

One way to think about Christians (and the churches they make up) is they are musicians playing God's music in the world. Occasionally we'll play it perfectly and it's a wonderful thing to experience. Most often there are a few wrong notes or slightly off-key – not perfect, but still pretty good. Sometimes the tune is barely recognisable and there are even times when some completely different music is being played and people pretend it's God's.

Sadly, there are many people who have had bad experiences of the church and of 'Christians'- those claiming to be playing God's music. Those experiences can lead people to turn away from God, to curse God or deny God's existence. But should we hate the composer because an orchestra gets the music wrong?

There are lots of different orchestras and most of them try really hard to play God's music well. So, if you've only experienced it done badly or you've listened and thought, "did God really write this?" - maybe try another orchestra? Or if you're not ready for that perhaps listen to the music God is humming in your heart? Though He does want us to join in, God can make His own music in the world too!

As people, we are never going to get things 100% right all the time. And parts of God's music for the world are that we can mess up and still be invited to pick up our instruments and carry on playing. But when others, or even ourselves, get the music wrong, remember that the composer, the creator of the piece, still wants us to know the beauty of the notes He laid down.

# BOROUGH GREEN PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT MAY 2024

It has been an interesting year, a very interesting year, but the trials we have been through together have bought us all closer and I thank all my Councillors for their support during the year. Christian and Ian left and will be sorely missed, but we welcome our newcomers and wish them well.

I want to pass on special thanks to Tim and Scott - we have been a team for longer than I can remember - to Sue for her support as my Vice Chair and her skills at organising events like the Coronation Celebration, 4x4 Santa and next month's D-Day80 event, and to Mark for his commitment but also his navigation skills in the murky world of the internet and social media.

My gratitude to my Clerk, Bernie, without whose unfailing support and knowledge I could not have managed. I can happily leave the money side to him - his knowledge of accounting and his uncanny ability to obtain grant funding have allowed us to give real support to our residents. And we just had notification that the Internal Auditor has given Bernie's 2023/24 accounts a 100% clean bill of health, again.

Bernie has also welded Rob and Barry into an effective team and the three of them together in their spare time have generated thousands of pounds for multiple charities, at home and abroad, but crucially for Ukraine and Gaza.

The community ethos has led to us clashing with the Village Hall Management and we are stepping back from our former close involvement. A community asset like the hall should be managed to benefit our residents and the Parish Council will continue grant aid to the hall if and when required. The survival of the hall is more important than individual personalities and it has survived worse than this in the past.

The Parish Council's main ethos is our community, first and last. We have done that by increasing our ownership of wild amenity land around the village, converting our streetlighting to LED saving thousands in annual power costs, the solar projects at Potters Mede and the Bowls Club, and the Alliance Shopper Bus Scheme. Some of our land off Harrison Rd will soon be used as overflow parking for our Medical Practice which has grown dramatically and is pushed for space.

The Borough Green Junior Football Club continues to grow and has taken on a far greater responsibility for pitch maintenance as a partner with the Parish Council. (See report on page 13)

Bernie has managed significant growth in bookings at Potters Mede over the past year, but we never lose sight of our duty to the whole community and we now support a range of events from the youngest to the oldest, nursery to sitting exercise, and providing a venue for groups that help the more vulnerable through these difficult times. Traffic and the solution for improving life in our constituency. Inclusion of long overdue - missing East Facing Slip Roads in the vicinity of M25, J5 Sevenoaks, Kent in Transport For Southeast Strategic Investment Plan

We have supported previous consultations from Transport for the Southeast(TfSE), a team made up of representatives from LEPs, councils across the South East and businesses too. They are consulting on the next Strategic Investment Plan (SIP), and the priorities for investment across the South East in the coming years.

As a community we should be concerned that there is still no reference to the challenges of the current road network on the A25 and A227 in our West Kent area in their current Strategy, or mention of the construction of the long overdue missing 'East facing slip roads in the vicinity of M25 Junction 5 Sevenoaks, Kent'.

It is important for the next SIP to include the re-instatement of these slip roads. We have continued to contribute to the strategy and are once again requesting support from our residents for these slip roads.

We support Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council along with Sevenoaks District Council aims to become regions of 'net zero carbon' via their Carbon Neutral 2030 plans that are dependent upon improving highways and traffic schemes that are underpinned by the re-instatement of the missing slip roads in the vicinity of M25 J5 Sevenoaks to connect the M26 and A21. The connectivity will enable all 'passing through' freight and traffic to remain on the Strategic Highways Network rather than get stuck in West Kent villages. A big improvement for all concerned.

A high-quality, reliable, safe and accessible highways network is achievable in West Kent via the J5 slip roads and will offer seamless door to door travel enabling business to compete and trade more effectively in the local, UK and European marketplace and giving our West Kent residents and visitors the highest quality of life.

The slip roads are aligned to sustainable development in economic improved productivity, social improved health, safety, wellbeing, quality of life and providing access to opportunity for everyone. Additionally, the West Kent and wider South East unique natural and historic environment will be ensured of protection and nurturing whilst tackling climate change. They form part of Kent County Council Local Transport Plan (LTP) 4 Delivering Growth Without Gridlock (2016-31). Local authorities of Tonbridge and Malling, Sevenoaks and Tunbridge Wells along with the Road Haulage Association, Freight Transport Association, Kent Chambers of Commerce and Kent Area Local Councils (KALC) have always been active campaigners in the case for the re-instatement of these slip roads. The slip roads will facilitate an M26 – A21 West Kent Bypass.

On behalf of so many people, I have continued to request that our transport body represents our concerns on health, safety, environment and overall quality of life, and to ensure that this broken network at the M25 J5 interchange is improved by the connection of M26 and A21 to keep passing through freight and traffic on the motorway network and not in our West Kent villages.

The slip roads have also been continually short listed in the National Highways Roads Investment Strategies (RIS1) 2015-20 and (RIS2) 2020-25 Strategies. We believe with support from our governing transport body that the inclusion can be successful this time around in (RIS3) 2025-30.

But it is also critical that our J5 campaign, which has been sitting on desks in Westminster, is driven passionately and eagerly by elected representatives. That I can assure you I intend to do if elected. Meanwhile, I would like to encourage everyone to email or write to Transport for Southeast requesting the slip roads be included in their transport strategy going forward.

#### **Borough Green Medical Practice June 2024**

This is produced for the benefit of all patients for sharing information and updates on a regular basis.





My name is Ryan and I am the Clinical Pharmacist at Borough Green Medical Practice.

I began working in general practice in 2016 and qualified as a prescribing practitioner in 2018, whilst starting at Borough Green in September 2022. Since then I have developed a keen interest in

cardiovascular prevention mainly by optimising patients' blood pressure and cholesterol-lowering medication. I am always keen to proactively diagnose and optimise treatment in various areas and am involved in facilitating this for osteoporosis, heart failure and chronic kidney disease.

I have daily telephone clinic appointments (booked through reception in the usual way) speaking to patients about general medication queries as well as the above. In March 2024 we also employed a Pharmacy Technician who assists with medication supply problems, basic medication queries and many of the administrative tasks involving medication such as audits and updating repeat medication following hospital admissions and outpatient clinics.

# Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council items

#### New team to tackle anti-social behaviour

A specialist team of three trained officers will target anti-social behaviour hot spots in Tonbridge and Malling this summer, responding to complaints about rowdy behaviour, drinking and other activities, such as car meets, which cause a nuisance or disturbance to residents. Their presence on the streets is also aimed at deterring offenders and providing public reassurance. The officers will be deployed by Tonbridge and Malling's Community Safety Unit which is staffed by officers from the borough council and Kent Police.

#### Borough Green - Links to Normandy Landings

It is uncertain if there is such a link but the only person named on the Borough Green War Memorial who may have been involved was David Summers given his regiment and the service he was in. Despite the uncertainty I am repeating below the article that Suzanne Young produced about him as it references landing craft used in the Normandy Landings and so may be of interest.

#### **David John Summers**

David John Summers was born on 24 September 1924 and is the son of Frederick Charles and Mabel Summers (née Russell) who were married in 1923.

In 1939 David Summers was living with his parents, Charles and Mabel, at 25 Spencer's Cottages, Station Road, Borough Green. David was a general agricultural worker working with horses and his father is also listed as a general agricultural worker. David's father is also listed as being part of a demolition and rescue team, part of the preparations for WW2.

Unfortunately, I am unable to find much information on David John Summers (CH/X 112514) but I do know that he was a Royal Marine on LCS (M) 902 (Landing Craft Support). He died on 12 February 1945 at the age of 21 and is buried in the Wissenkerke General Cemetery, Zeeland, Netherlands.

#### A Landing Craft Support (Medium) in South West Holland

The Landing Craft Support was used to provide heavy machine gun firepower close in. The Landing Craft Support (Medium) (LCS (M)), Mark 2 and Mark 3 were used by the British forces at Normandy. The crew was Royal Navy, with Royal Marines to operate the weapons: two 0.5 inch Vickers machine guns and a 4-inch mortar to fire smoke shells.
