This is a draft list of names for our War Memorial. If you have a relative who is not named let us know. The final list will be confirmed at the end of the year, and the Memorial Mason commissioned to make the tablets.

Borough Green did not exist during WW1, and was a tiny area during WW2, so the names are all those who died from what is now the Civil Parish of Borough Green, and we are aware that some are listed as from other parishes, or are already listed on other Memorials. We took the view that it is better to be named twice than forgotten completely.

We have also taken the opportunity to commemorate our heritage, which is quarrying, and to affirm the strong ties with our neighbouring parishes. Two odd bricks installed in the rear of the main plaque are from Platt War Memorial, and from the foundations of Russell's Greengrocers that used to stand on this site, with Brigg's General Store. The quoined ragstone and local bricks reflect local building styles.
